Brett Aggregates Ltd - Newhaven Port

I am writing to let you know that Brett Aggregates Ltd is holding a public exhibition of its proposals for the development of a new minerals importation aggregates wharf at Newhaven Port, Newhaven.

A full Environmental Impact Assessment is being undertaken in preparation for the submission of a planning application later in the summer.

We are proposing to utilise the Port's East Quay and associated land to enable marine-dredged sand and gravel to be unloaded, processed and bagged for delivery by road and rail, for housing and infrastructure construction needs across East Sussex and into London.

This proposed development would:

- support the Port Masterplan - approved by local and national government - that seeks to increase the amount of marine traffic using the port and attract new businesses to use its facilities;
- generate employment opportunities;
- act as a catalyst for further Port and road developments and employment opportunities; and
- create an additional aggregates supply point to support housing and infrastructure construction activity in East Sussex and London

The exhibition will outline plans for the importation and processing of sea dredged sand and gravel, together with the preparation and manufacture of value added products on land at East Quay at Newhaven Port.

The exhibition is to be held at The Hillcrest Community Centre, between 10am and 2pm on Saturday 15th July 2017, then repeated between 1pm and 9pm on Monday 24th July 2017.

The exhibition is open to all members of the public who wish to see the details of the proposals.
