**Description:** The construction and use of plant, namely aggregate processing plant, aggregate bagging plant, concrete batching plant, concrete block-making plant and buildings, ancillary offices and stores for processing and utilising aggregates landed at Newhaven Port and distribution of the products by road and rail together with access to the public highway and the extension of an existing rail siding.

**Comments:** Dear ESCC As a loyal resident of Seaford, please consider this as my objection to the Brett Aggregates application for a permit to build and mobilise a cement works at the natural beauty spot of Tidemills. My objections are three-fold: 1 – the air pollution is likely to spread across Newhaven and into Seaford causing many health issues 2 – the noise pollution from the plant running 24 hours a day 3 – the traffic pollution, damage to the roads from the lorries and constant opening of Newhaven bridge 4 - the irreparable damage it will cause to the natural beauty spot at Tide Mills 5 - the eye-sore it will create at the shoreline giving a smoggy sunset view Would it not be better to leave Tide Mills as a beautiful place for families, walkers and dog walkers and perhaps regenerate it thoughtfully by offering cafes/ restaurants/ in-keeping residential properties?
