Description: The construction and use of plant, namely aggregate processing plant, aggregate bagging plant, concrete batching plant, concrete block-making plant and buildings, ancillary offices and stores for processing and utilising aggregates landed at Newhaven Port and distribution of the products by road and rail together with access to the public highway and the extension of an existing rail siding.

Comments: I object to this development because of the destructive effects it will have upon the regeneration of Newhaven Port as a clean and green port. It will be intrusive to the local residents and will not be conducive to the local tourist industry in Newhaven and Seaford bay. It will cause light and air pollution, both directly from the plant and as a result of increased lorry traffic. There will be increased congestion on already overloaded local road systems. Tidemills is a conservation area for wildlife and this development will have a negative impact upon this beautiful habitat. The pier has been a local fishing site for over 200 years, which the proposal plans to take away. The sandy beach at low tide is enjoyed by walkers, dog walkers, horse riders, fisherman.
