Description: The construction and use of plant, namely aggregate processing plant, aggregate bagging plant, concrete batching plant, concrete block-making plant and buildings, ancillary offices and stores for processing and utilising aggregates landed at Newhaven Port and distribution of the products by road and rail together with access to the public highway and the extension of an existing rail siding.

Comments: I am concerned that the noise, dust and increased traffic from this development will have an adverse effect on our health and the natural environment. The prevailing south west wind, very strong at times, will spread dust onto the adjoining nature reserve, Mill Creek and the sea, as well as into our lungs. This is a dirty, low-tech development not in keeping with the Clean Green, high-tech energy industries proposed for this site and Newhaven in general. Traffic in this area is already often at a standstill and the 6 additional lorries an hour will just queue up behind each other, waiting to join the congestion on the main road. The anticipated number of jobs is low for a site of this size, and there appears to be no other benefit for the people of Newhaven. Going ahead with this development will prevent the use of the site for better, cleaner, high-tech energy developments which would benefit and improve Newhaven.
