1. Appropriate Flood Risk Management Measures are carried out, as stated in Section 8.0 of the FRA.

The mitigation measure shall be fully implemented prior to occupation and subsequently in accordance with the timing / phasing arrangements embodied within the scheme, or within any other period as may subsequently be agreed, in writing, by the local planning authority.

## Advice to applicant

In addition to any other permission(s) that the applicant may have already obtained, e.g. planning permission, the applicant will need an Environmental Permit for Flood Risk Activities (formerly known as Flood Defence Consent prior to 06 April 2016) as the applicant wants to carry out work in, under, over or near a main river and in the flood plain of a main river.

There are a number of elements of work which will require an Environmental Permit, such as the proposed new bridges, upgrading of existing bridges, resurfacing of existing right of way, proposed trees/planting and any other permanent or temporary works in under, over or within 8m of the Main River. ### **Newhaven Flood Alleviation scheme**

There is a Newhaven Flood Alleviation scheme commencing in Autumn 2016 with completion in late 2019 which will protect this site to a greater standard of protection.

The scheme includes the provision of earth embankments, concrete walls and flood gates to the town of Newhaven, East Sussex. This will provide a Standard of Protection for a 1 in 200 year return period event for the next 55 years and will reduce the risk of flooding to existing residential and commercial properties, including Newhaven Port, industrial areas, road networks and the railway line.
