**Town and Country Planning Act 1990 Relating to land known as A259 Belle Hill,
Bexhill on Sea to B2092 Queensway, St. Leonards on Sea, East Sussex
RR/247/CC(EIA) – Condition 9 - Temporary Construction Works.**

Following your approval letter (Ref: RR/2474/CC(EIA)) dated 07/10/2013, to use an alternative route through Glovers Lane for 1no. low loader and 2no. trailers, we are now seeking approval to use this route to allow the plant to leave site.

The reason we need to use an alternative access route through Glovers Lane is due to the height restrictions at Ninfield Road Bridge, preventing use of the access from the Elva Way entrance, but also the gradient of the haul road through Decoy Pond restricts entry from the Hastings end of the scheme.

This application covers the egress from the site of 2no. CMC rigs and it's associated equipment in consecutive weeks. The necessity to use the Glovers Lane access route would be between 10:00am - 15:00pm on the following dates:

- 1st Set of Vehicles to leave site:
 - Either Tuesday 07th January or Wednesday 08th January 2014.
- 2nd Set of Vehicles to leave site:
 - Either Monday 13th January or Tuesday 14th January or Wednesday 15th January 2014.

A letter drop will be carried out to the residents along Glover Lane as per previous occasions that we have used this route for access.

This application is made on behalf of the Assistant Director – Transport and Operations, East Sussex County Council and the relevant cost code for payment of fees due is C.5.04.200.2
