Details of the pre-application advice received	
The site wholly lies within the High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The applicant is advised to seek advice on the design of the proposal from the High Weald AONB Unit and refer to the High Weald Management Plan. The Arboricultural Impact Assessment (The Mayhew Consultancy Ltd, October 2022) states that at least one tree would require removal as a result of the proposal, and possibly a second dependent on where the construction access is located. An additional tree is marked for removal as it is dead. The Report also states that aside from trees, the primary vegetation within the site is improved grassland which is regularly maintained. The grassland habitats, trees and building on site offer potential for protected species, including, but not limited to bats, breeding birds, great crested newts (GCN) and reptiles. Of particular note are nearby records of GCN and reptiles (within 100m of the site. The site also lies within the red zone of the impact risk maps for the GCN District Licence, indicating highly suitable habitat and the most important areas for GCN. The applicant may wish to consider entering into the District Licence scheme to address any potential impacts on GCN; the scheme is administered by NatureSpace on behalf of the County Council. Therefore, any planning application should be informed by an Ecological Impact Assessment (EcIA). In line with
