I give notice that at their meeting on 10 December 2008 the Planning Committee of the Regulatory Committee of the County Council were minded to grant planning permission for the following development:

RR/2474/CC(EIA) — Construction of new road, including environmental treatment with earthworks, planting flood and noise attenuation, wildlife compensation, and facilities for non-motorised users, AC59 Belle Hill, Bexhill-on-Sea to B2092 Queensway, St Leonards-on-Sea.

Following consideration by the Planning Committee the application was referred to the Secretary of State as being contrary to certain provisions of the Development Plan. On 3 February 2009 the Secretary of State confirmed that the Planning Application would not be called in for her own determination. A legal undertaking has been signed by East Sussex County Council and planning permission was granted on 28 July 2009, subject to a number of conditions. The decision in respect of this application was taken following the consideration of environmental information contained in the Environmental Statement accompanying the planning application submitted by East Sussex County Council on 18 April 2007, the Environmental Statement Addendum submitted in August 2008 and the Supplementary Nature Conservation Report submitted in October 2008.
